### Financial Update

Year-to-date April financials continue to be within the operating budget.

### Operating Fund Revenues:

Total \$88,004, which is ahead of the budget by 7%,. This is driven by unpledged contributions. Many thanks go out to the Congregation.

### **Expenses:**

Total \$65,254, which is favorable to the budget by 3%. Building expenses are unfavorable to the budget by \$4,500. This expense will be reclassified to the temporary restricted funds account, which will be reflected in the June financials. All other category expenses are either on budget or favorable to the budget.

# St. Clement's Memorial Garden Memorial Bricks

A way to mark a sacred place for loved ones whose remains are elsewhere.

Bricks are 8" x 4" with three lines of text, up to 20 characters each (including spaces).

The laser engraving technique "burns" into the face of the brick creating a glass surface that is naturally black and completely permanent.

### Guidelines:

- -We request that 'IN MEMORY OF' be used for the top line to maintain a consistency that is in keeping with the original design of the Memorial Garden.
- -We request that the memorial bricks only be used for human loved ones. We can design a separate pet memorial if there is a strong desire.
- -Once 25 bricks have been purchased, we can place the order.
